FIRE PERMITS

A fire permit is required if you are burning brush or wood demolition debris. You will need to contact the Maine Forest Service in Old Town at 207-827-1800. You will need at least two adults, a water supply and hand tools. Keep the number they give you handy. Until this week, it's been very dry, so be careful that it's all out.

Burning Trash

Remember that it's against Maine law to burn trash. **Please carry out, recycle and compost!**

Summer Work Sessions

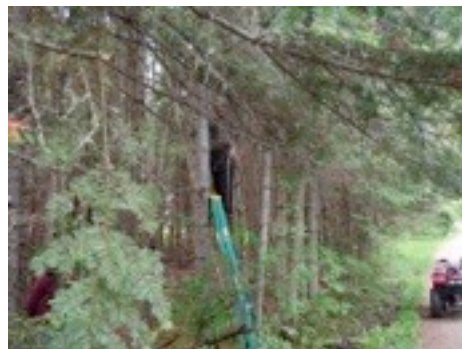
